## INCIDENT SUMMARY

<b>Incident Summary:</b>	<p>Just after 10:30 p.m., Santa Clara County Fire Department was dispatched to a report of a structure fire in a residence on the 1600 block of Hacienda Avenue in Campbell. On arrival, firefighters found a two story, single family residence with two residents waiting outside. Neighbors on-scene reported hearing a loud sound and seeing a fire on the second floor. Upon investigation, firefighters found smoke coming from a second floor bedroom to the rear of the home. Crews made entry into the structure, and were able to quickly contain the fire to the single bedroom.</p> <p>The residence sustained fire damage to the second floor bedroom and smoke and water damage to approximately 25% of the home. One occupant sustained minor smoke-related injuries, but declined medical attention at the scene. The two residents displaced by the fire did not require assistance.</p> <p>Crews remained on scene through the early morning hours for extensive cleanup. The cause of the fire is under investigation.</p> <p>Santa Clara County Fire Department reminds residents to always have a way out when attempting to extinguish a small fire in the home. If a fire grows or is too big to safely extinguish, evacuate immediately and call 9-1-1.</p>
