## INCIDENT SUMMARY

<b>Incident Summary:</b>	<p>At approximately 2:12 a.m., Santa Clara County Fire Department was dispatched to a report of a structure fire in a residence on the 20200 block of Miljevich Drive in Saratoga. On arrival, firefighters found smoke and fire coming from a one story, single family residence. One resident had evacuated the home and indicated that there were no other occupants inside.</p> <p>At approximately 2:33 a.m., a second alarm was requested due to the extent of the fire and nearby exposures – adjacent homes and vegetation. The fire was brought under control just after 3:00 a.m.</p> <p>The residence sustained fire and smoke damage throughout. One resident was displaced by the fire and did not require assistance. Crews remained on scene through the early morning hours for extensive cleanup. The cause of the fire is under investigation.</p> <p>Santa Clara County Fire Department reminds residents that working smoke alarms save lives. Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside every sleeping area and on every level of your home. Small fires grow quickly, keep living spaces free of excess materials that can burn.</p>
