## INCIDENT SUMMARY

<b>Incident Summary:</b>	<p>At approximately 6:18 a.m., Santa Clara County Fire Department was dispatched to a report of a structure fire at 1250 S. Clover Avenue in Campbell.</p> <p>On arrival, firefighters found a house with a garage and roof on fire. Campbell PD was on scene and had safely evacuated two occupants from the home. Heavy smoke and fire were coming from the roof above the garage and firefighters worked quickly to ensure that all residents had been evacuated and to protect adjacent structures.</p> <p>The fire was brought under control within approximately 55 minutes. The garage and attic sustained heavy fire damage. The living space of the home sustained moderate damage from smoke and fire. Two residents were displaced by the fire but were not injured and did not require medical assistance. The cause of the fire is under investigation. Crews will remain on scene to conduct extensive overhaul.</p> <p>Santa Clara County Fire Department reminds residents that smoke alarms save lives. Working smoke alarms increase your chances of surviving a fire by 50%. Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home. Test smoke alarms once a month. Replace smoke alarm units every 10 years.</p>
