Introduction

In order to rapidly and accurately identify single and grouped resources used on multi-agency incidents within Santa Clara County, it is necessary to have a standard resource designation system.

Information

A. **SINGLE TYPED RESOURCES** - Single resources will be identified by agency and equipment number. Example: Santa Clara Engine One, SNC E1

1. Unless otherwise specified, Engines, Trucks, Brush Patrols (Initial Attack Apparatus), and Hazardous Materials Units shall be dispatched for general mission and **not** by minimum standard ICS type.
2. If need dictates response of resources by specific ICS type, the following table will be used:

C. **ALARM ASSIGNMENT** - Alarm assignments will be identified by single resource agency and equipment number until assigned in a larger resource grouping on an incident.

D. STRIKE TEAM/TASK FORCE:

1. Strike Teams formed at an incident or for response outside Santa Clara County shall utilize the O.E.S. Resource Designation System block numbering concept. Numbers and letters indicate:
