JUNE EVENTS



WEDNESDAY, JUNE 3

On Wednesday June 3 at approximately 4:55 p.m., the Santa Clara County Fire Department was dispatched to a smoke investigation in the city of Campbell. When the first engine arrived, firefighters located a large church filled with dark smoke. The firefighters were able to quickly extinguish the fire and keep it to the building of origin. Thankfully, the adjacent pre-school building was not involved. No occupants or firefighters sustained injuries. The origin and cause of the fire is currently under investigation.

MONDAY, JUNE 22

At approximately 9:40 a.m. on June 22, firefighters from the Saratoga fire station responded to reports of a vehicle over the side of a mountain in the area of Redwood Gulch Road. Firefighters located a solo vehicle approximately 300’ down the embankment. The occupants were extricated and the scene was left in the care of the California Highway Patrol.



TUESDAY, JUNE 23



Units were dispatched to a reported vegetation fire in the area of Redwood Retreat Road. Once on scene a small vegetation fire was found with one outside structure on fire. Firefighters quickly extinguished the structure fire and the surrounding vegetation fire. Great job done by all responding agencies Gilroy Fire Department, CAL FIRE and Santa Clara County Fire.

EMERGENCY PLANNING COLLABORATION

County Fire’s Emergency Management team is partnering with the Town of Los Altos Hills on a year-long effort to boost local disaster resilience. The collaboration includes updating the Town’s Emergency Operations Plan and conducting joint training exercises. By sharing subject-matter expertise, including a recent briefing to the Town's Emergency Preparedness Committee, County Fire is helping Los Altos Hills ensure its readiness aligns with regional best practices.

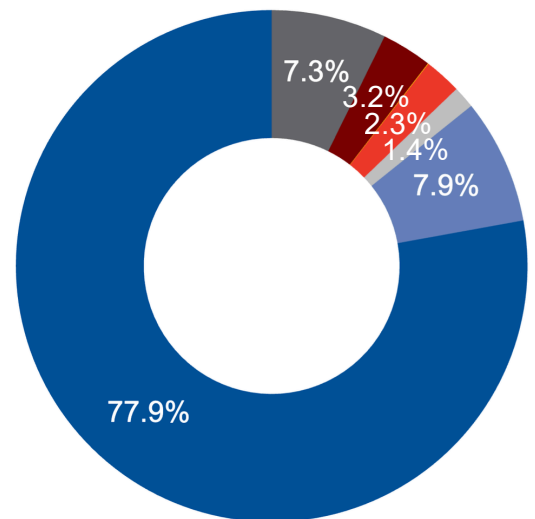

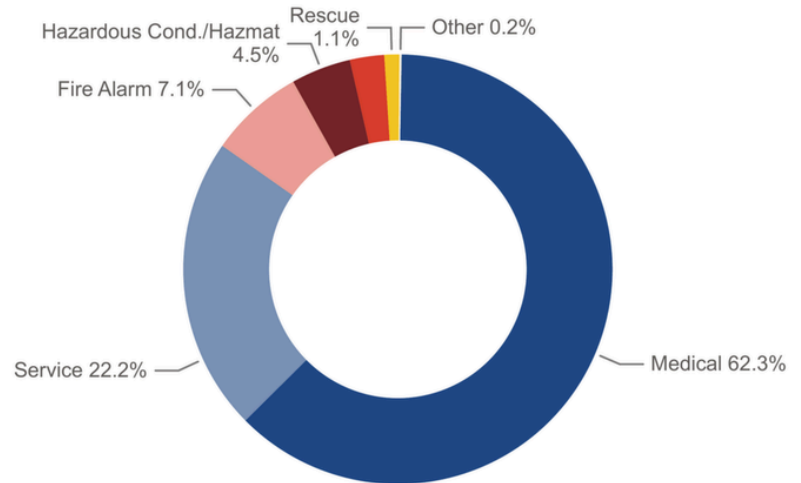

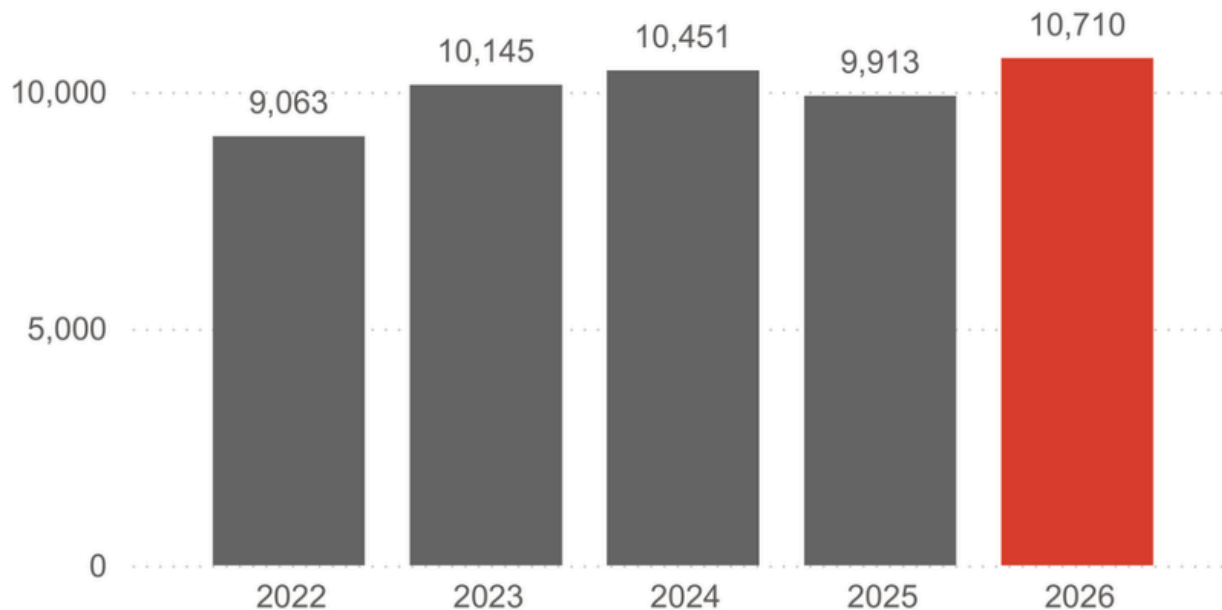

Number of Incidents Year to Date Year Over Year - January to June

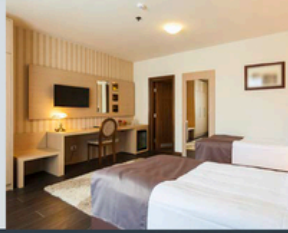


TRAVEL SAFETY TIPS

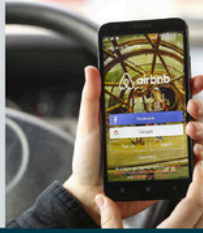
Whether you are planning a late summer get-away or getting ready to see your young adult off to college, we want to remind you to take time for safety wherever you go.

Short-Term Rental Fire Safety



Did you know?

Fire safety is important, even when you are away from home.

Keep your family safe by staying in hotels and motels that have hard-wired smoke alarms and an automatic fire sprinkler system in each guest room.

After you check in, you and your family should:

- ✓ Read the fire evacuation plan carefully.
- ✓ Find the two closest exits from your room.
- ✓ Count the number of doors between your room and the exits. This will help if you need to get out in the dark.
- ✓ Find the fire alarms on your floor.

Many people enjoy renting homes or apartments for vacation. These rentals are not regulated like hotels and motels. Practice home safety in rentals just like you do at home.

Be sure:

- Everyone knows the address of the rental.
- Everyone knows two ways out of every room and out of the rental if there is an emergency.
- There are working smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of the rental.
- There are working carbon monoxide alarms on every level of the rental.
- You can open all doors and windows that lead outside.
- You choose an outside meeting place a safe distance from the rental.
- Everyone knows where to find a first-aid kit.
